Skills: Animal recognition and facts, reading left to right, prewriting skills

Parents: Read the sentence to your child, following with your finger from left to right. Tell your child facts about dogs, such as “The fastest dog in the world is the greyhound. It can run as fast as a car.” Have your child help the dog fetch the ball by tracing the dotted line.

Dogs can fetch.

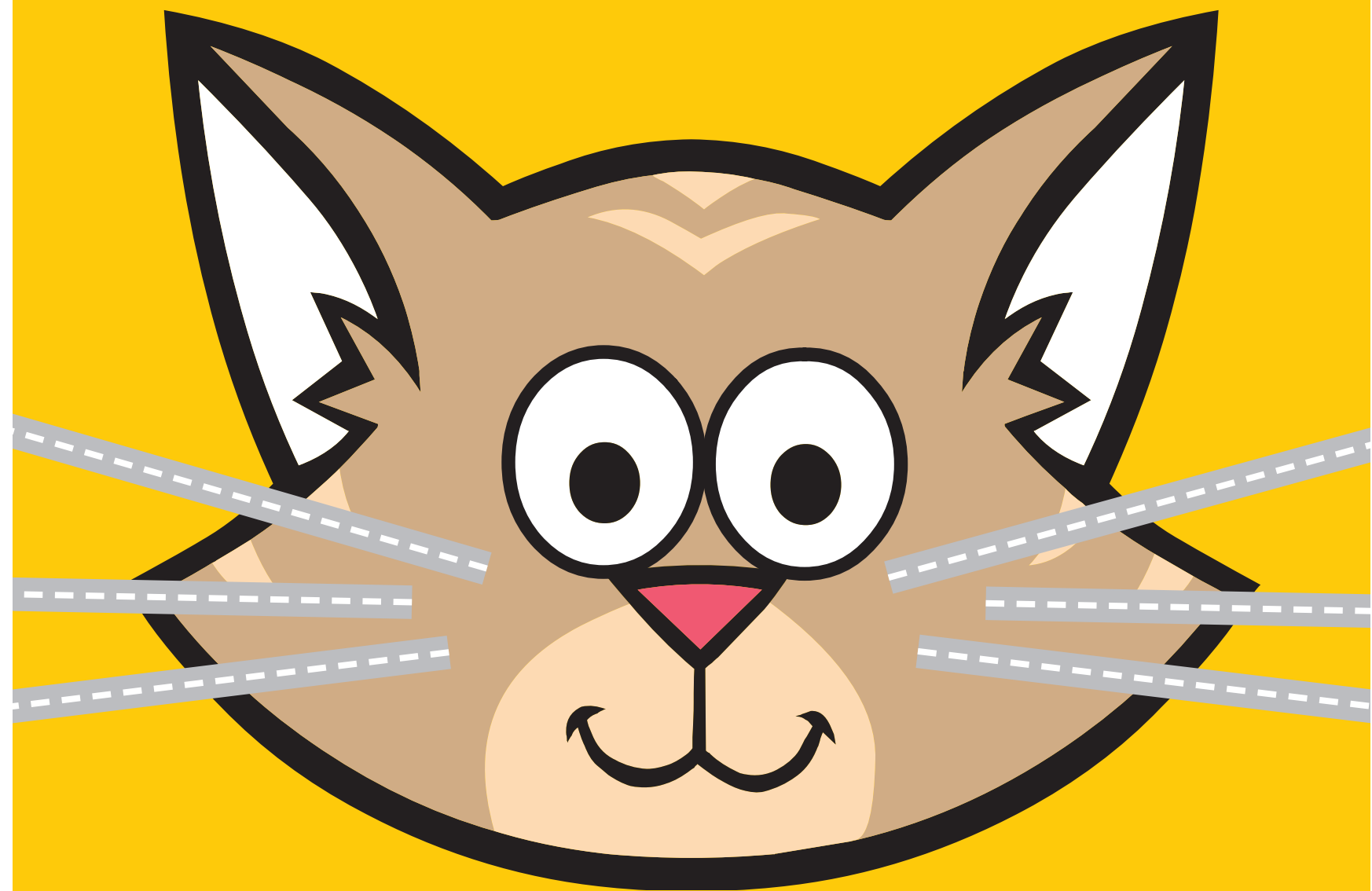


PETS

Skills: Animal recognition and facts, reading left to right, cutting short lines

Parents: Read the sentence to your child, following with your finger from left to right. Tell your child facts about cats, such as “Cats take baths by licking themselves clean.” Have your child cut along the gray dotted lines to give the cat whiskers.

Cats have whiskers.

Skills: Animal recognition and facts, reading left to right, prewriting skills

Parents: Read the sentence to your child, following with your finger from left to right. Tell your child facts about hamsters, such as “A hamster’s cheeks can stretch into two big pockets.” Have your child trace the dotted lines to give the hamster two big cheeks. Then color the hamster.

Hamsters can carry a lot of food in their cheeks.
